

# **Health & Safety on the golf course**

- Attention is drawn to the public footpaths that cross the 11th fairway and alongside the boundaries of the golf course.
- Golf shoes with studs appropriate for the prevailing weather and ground conditions must be worn. Particular care is encouraged when walking on slopes and steps.
- Designated steps and paths should be used where available.
- On holes 3, 9, 11 and 17, particular care should be taken to make sure players in front are clear before playing tee shots. A warning bell is situated to the right hand side of the 9th fairway.
- On holes 16 and 17, would golfers please be reminded of the road and housing estate to the left of the hole. In the event of any errant shots leaving the golf course would golfers please inform the pro shop immediately upon their return to the clubhouse.
- When playing the 18th hole, would golfers please be mindful of the public footpath on the right hand side of the hole and the access road which crosses the fairway.
- It is advised that golfers adhere to using the word 'fore' in situations that may place others in danger.
- It is every golfer's responsibility to ensure they have adequate insurance cover for injury or damages to a third party.

# **Buggies**

Please also refer to Health & Safety signs on the buggy windshield

- Care must always be taken when operating buggies.
- Take extra care when driving around the clubhouse and driving range
- Avoid driving buggies in areas which are extremely undulating.
- It is mandatory to keep to all buggy paths.
- Buggies must be kept a minimum of 10 yards from green and tee surrounds, unless a designated buggy path is in place.
- Any damages caused will be the sole responsibility of the named hirer as agreed when registering at the pro shop.
- Cookridge Hall Golf Club reserves the right to refuse or recall usage of buggies at any time, for any reason that may include reckless driving.

# **Health & Safety on the driving range**

- It is advised that appropriate footwear is worn when using the range such as golf shoes or trainers.
- Under no circumstances should anyone leave the confines of the driving range bays in order to retrieve balls from the grassed area in front.
- Access to and from the driving range must be via designated entrances and exits. Under no circumstances should patrons enter or exit via the professionals teaching bays at either end of the range.
- Only one person should enter driving range bays at any one time, please be aware of other range users swinging golf clubs.
- Please pay extra care when Range Assistants are collecting balls, and refrain from hitting balls at the ball picking machine.

# DRESS CODE

## Main Lounge/Bar:

**Dress code is smart casual at all times.**

- No caps, hats, tracksuits, or gym clothing at any time
- No golf shoes nor flip flop footwear is permitted
- No soiled clothing at any time
- Golf shirts must be tucked into trousers or shorts at all times
- Footwear must be worn in the Main Lounge/Bar

(Please be reminded denim jeans must be clean and without tears or holes)

## Golf Course:

### Gentlemen

- Tailored trousers (no jeans, tracksuits or cargo pants)
- Tailored shorts only (no beach attire)
- Shirts with collars or roll necks: shirts must be tucked into trousers or shorts at all times ( no t-shirts)
- Caps, if worn, must have the peak to the front
- Golf shoes must be worn

### Ladies:

- Tailored trousers, shorts or skirts/skorts (no jeans, tracksuits or cargo pants)
- Shirts with collars or roll necks
- Golf shoes must be worn
